Energypedia is an internet platform similar to Wikipedia\*. Energypedia provides articles about renewable energies and experiences in the context of development aid. These articles are and will be updated continuously with everyone's collaboration (collective intelligence)!

Unlike conventional web-platforms, energypedia allows all its users to make their contributions. Providing and revising knowledge (in terms of wiki articles about renewable energies) is not organized in responsibilities or hierarchies. All wiki users are equal, everyone has the right to create content.

As a result, all relevant content concerning renewable energies in the context of development aid are available and continuously revised.

It works - Wikipedia has already proved it!

\*A Wiki is a system of sites. Users can not only read but also edit articles directly online.

#### Edit an article:

Click the "edit" tab at the top of the article. The respective text appears in a box and can be edited. Use the toolbox on the top to format the text, insert links, etc. Click the "save" button at the bottom after editing.



#### Create an article:

- In general: Search for an article. If it does not exist yet, click "Create the page "xy" on this wiki!" to type in your text.
- While editing an article, highlight a suitable word that will link to your new article later. Then click the

edit/insert link symbol in the toolbar. Type the desired name of your article into the panel "link". Click "save" at the bottom, then click the newly created link to start writing your article.



# Always make sure to click the "save" button after editing articles!

#### Newsblog:

To spread information to the energypedia community, use the Newsblog to create a new article. Once you click "save", your news are posted and an email with your news will be sent to the energypedia community automatically.

# Group/social networking:

Groups are available to facilitate the association of experts on specific subjects. The aim is to support networking and exchange information.
